In August 2007, Rocky Mountain Cancer Centers (RMCC), in Boulder, CO, began offering *The Seven Levels of Healing*<sup>®</sup> integrative oncology education and support program to anyone touched by cancer; including patients, relatives, friends, and health professionals. Specially trained RMCC staff facilitate the 7-week Program's weekly 2-hour sessions. Potential participants attend a 2-hour Introductory Session prior to enrolling, and feedback forms were collected at the end of each session and upon Program completion. In the first nine months of the project, 94 individuals participated in the Program, with outstanding feedback. Based on these results, RMCC decided to expand the Program in its network of community-based centers in Colorado, and it was subsequently successfully implemented in 8 additional RMCC facilities. Between August 2007 and June 2013, 924 individuals participated in 81 seven-week *Seven Levels of Healing*<sup>®</sup> programs at 9 RMCC implementation sites. Results were presented in poster sessions at the 5<sup>th</sup> International Conference of the Society for Integrative Oncology, Atlanta, GA, November 2008; the 7<sup>th</sup> International Conference of the Society for Integrative Oncology, New York, NY, November 2010; and at the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of the American Psychosocial Oncology Society, Anaheim, CA, February 2011. Results were also presented in a podium presentation at the 8<sup>th</sup> International Conference of the Society for Integrative Oncology, Cleveland, OH, November 2011.

The GCCRI Blood, Urine and Tissue Clinical Data Bank. Established in December 1995, the bank's purpose is to identify and develop protein biomarkers that can be used as indicators or predictors of tumor activity, response to treatment, histological subtype, or prognosis in the diagnosis and treatment of cancer in humans. IRB approval was granted by the Essex Institutional Review Board, Inc., Lebanon, New Jersey. Between December 1995 and October 2003 this research protocol, GCCRI Study #95-001, collected, processed, and stored frozen serum and urine specimens from patients with cancer and hematologic disorders undergoing evaluation and treatment at the Geffen Cancer Center and Research Institute. During this time 48,537 serum samples (0.5 ml each) were collected from 1,437 patients. In addition, 757 urine samples (0.5 – 1.5 ml each) were collected from 484 patients. The samples are correlated with extensive patient clinical data, and organized in a proprietary computerized database created by Dr. Geffen and developed specifically to facilitate biomarker research. All samples and data were collected and documented under informed consent, consistent with HIPPA regulations. In June 2006, the repository was sold and transferred to OrthoClinical Diagnostics (OCD), Raritan, NJ, a division of Johnson & Johnson, for protein biomarker research and development.
